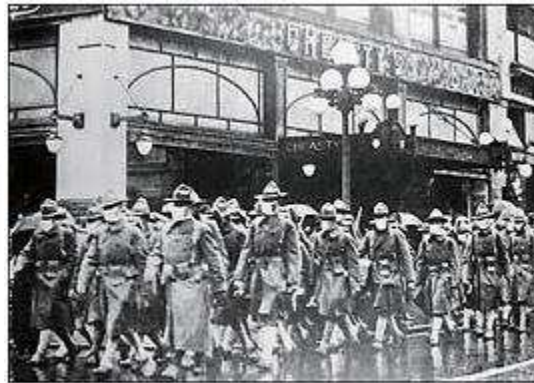

I look back on what my generation has seen from the rapid development and deployment of computers, graphics, cell phones (I remember those big military type ones), calculators (the first el-cheapo was \$100), I remember A-bomb drills in elementary school, the first 8086 PC and a thing called a “portable computer” that was as clunky and heavy as a portable sewing machine of the day. 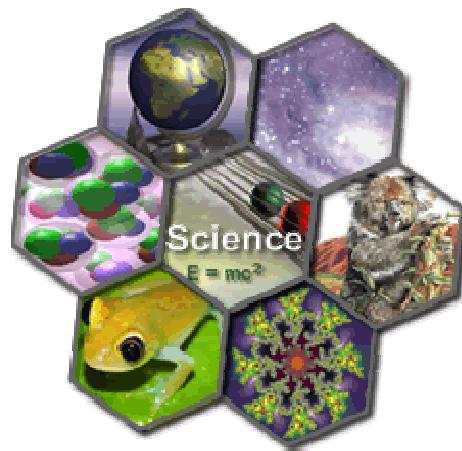


Various other religions also have eschatological beliefs associated with turning and redemption but the ones listed are the 'biggies' on our planet.



Since the advent of modern science in the 18th century, the discovery of deep time and the age of the Earth, the concept of an "End of Days" has more or less, been replaced in sciences contemporary discourse, with questions about the ultimate fate of the universe. Most scientists believe that the "end time" will finally occur hundreds of billions of years from now with the heat death of the universe.

Science has also given us 'Space Weather' with the monitoring of our own solar system, especially the sun and its solar storms (CME), as well as tracking asteroids and Oort Cloud comets; collecting the oldest reliable information on our planet from glaciers and ocean sea bed core samples and the Ozone Layer that protects us from UV rays; plate tectonic history, volcanoes and earthquakes; better weather prediction and severe storm warnings; nutrition and medical advances. 30 CE	About 30 CE: The Christian Scriptures (New Testament), when interpreted literally, appear to record many predictions by Yeshua of Nazareth (Jesus Christ) that God's Kingdom would arrive within a very short period, or was actually in the process of arriving. For example, Jesus is recorded as saying in Matthew 16:28 : "...there shall be some standing here, which shall not taste of death, till they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom." In Matthew 24:34 , Yeshua is recorded as saying: "...This generation shall not pass, till all these things be fulfilled." Since the life expectancy in those days was little over 30 years, Jesus appears to have predicted his second coming sometime during the 1 st century CE. It didn't happen. <u>More details.</u>
44	Theudas declared himself the Messiah, taking 400 people with him into the desert. T beheaded by Roman soldiers. Josephus records this.
53	Even before all the books of the Bible were written, there was talk that Christ's return had already taken place. The Thessalonians panicked on Paul, when they heard a rumor that the day of the Lord was at hand, and they had missed the rapture.
60 CE	About 60 CE: Interpreting the Epistles of Paul of Tarsus literally, his writings seem to imply that Jesus would return and usher in a <u>rapture</u> during the lifetime of persons who were living in the middle of the 1 st

66-70	According to Essenes It is believed this sect of Jewish ascetics saw the Jewish revolt against the Romans in 66-70 as the final end-time battle.
80	Ben Zakkai died about 80, and expected the Messiah about the time of his death
90 CE	About 90 CE: Saint Clement 1 predicted that the world end would occur at any moment.

Early Heretic Montanus Finds End of the World Cult

In the 2nd century, a native of what is now Turkey, Phrygia, and a pagan priest of an Oriental cult (yes, you can use this in a historical context) for Cybele (mother goddess of fertility) converted to Christianity and began a schism (or, an opposing group).

His ecstatic revelations, which were supposedly directly from God and which he told in the first person, claimed that the end of the world was near.



New Jerusalem was to drop from heaven right to his hometown of Pepuza, where only true believers would be allowed to live.


Montanus, with a prophetess on each arm, Priscilla and Maximilla (both of which had left their husbands to join the cult), set out to purify his followers by making them fast and denying them material possessions. His followers had seizures and uttered phrases in strange languages that were interpreted as oracles of the Holy Spirit.

Even though doomsday never came, the cult spread to North Africa and remained alive for centuries after Montanus and his two prophetesses had died and been buried in a shrine in Phrygia. Tertullian, the first Christian to compose in Latin, who came up with terms like The Trinity and Old and New Testaments was a devoted follower of Montanus' cult.

The motivation was to convert them all to Christianity, by force if necessary, before Christ returned in the year 1000. Meanwhile, some Christians had given their possessions to the Church in anticipation of the end. Fortunately, the level of education was so low that many citizens were unaware of the year. They did not know enough to be afraid. Otherwise, the panic might have been far worse than it was. Unfortunately, when Jesus did not appear, the church did not return the gifts. Serious criticism of the Church followed. The Church reacted by exterminating some heretics. Agitation settled down quickly, as it later did in the year 2000.</p> <p>This year goes down as one of the most pronounced states of hysteria over the return of Christ. All members of society seemed affected by the prediction that Jesus was coming back on Jan 1, 1000 AD. There really weren't any of the events required by the Bible transpiring at that time. 1135 - 1202	<p>The Calabrian monk, Joachim of Fiore (ca. A.D. 1135-1202) stands out as a key figure in medieval apocalypticism. On Easter Sunday in 1183 he was inspired to write his massive Exposition on Revelation. Later near the end of his life, he summarized his prophetic knowledge in the Book of Figures. His writings influenced a wide range of medieval events. The Franciscan order was founded on the basis that they would be the spiritual elite described in Joachim's "Age of the Spirit," a future time when God would send revelation directly to believers. Using Joachim's hints, writers concluded that the "Age of Grace" would end and the "Age of the Spirit" would begin in A.D. 1260. This prophecy, mixed with German social unrest, created a myth surrounding Frederick II. Having ruled from 1220 to 1250, many believed that Frederick was the "Emperor of the Last Days" who would usher in the new Millennium. The myth gained force when Frederick seized Jerusalem in 1229. When he died in 1250, a new myth started that Frederick would return from the dead. Two pseudo-Fredericks were burned at the stake by his successor to the throne. The Book of a Hundred Chapters stated that the returned Frederick would lead a fight against corruption in the state and the church, and that he will instruct his followers to "Go on hitting them" (referring to the Pope and his students) and to "Kill every one of them!" 1147	Gerard of Poehlde decided that the millennium had actually started in 306 CE during Constantine's reign. Thus, the world end was expected in 1306 CE.
1179	John of Toledo predicted the end of the world during 1186. This estimate was based on the alignment of many planets.
1186	The "Letter of Toledo" by John of Toledo warned everyone to hide in the caves and mountains. The world would be destroyed and only a few would be spared.
	
1200 - 1260	Joachim of Fiore an Italian mystic determined that the Millennium would begin between 1200 and 1260.
1205	Joachim of Fiore predicted in 1190 that the Antichrist was already in the world, and that King Richard of England would defeat him. The Millennium would then begin, sometime before 1205.
1284	Pope Innocent III computed this date by adding 666 years onto the date the Islam was founded.



1290	The followers of Joachim of Fiore rescheduled the End to 1290 when his 1260 prophecy failed.
1335	Another revised date of Joachim of Fiore.
1346 - 1351	The black plague spreading across Europe was interpreted by many as the sign of the end of times. The black plague spread across Europe, killing one third of the population. Unfortunately, the people had previously killed as many of the cats, fearing that they might be familiars of Witches. The fewer the cats, the more the rats. It was the rat fleas that spread the black plague.
1368	According to Jean de Roquetaillade the Antichrist was to come in 1366 and the Millennium would begin in 1368 or 1370.

1415	The Taborites, founded in A.D. 1415, also looked back to Joachim for their prophetic beliefs. They believed that once their persecutors were defeated, Christ would return and rule the world from Mount Tabor, a mountain they had renamed south of Prague. Their communal activities eventually turned bloody, prompted by tracts with lines like, "Accursed be the man who withholds his sword from shedding the blood of the enemies of Christ." (Paul Boyer, <i>When Time Shall Be No More: Prophecy Belief in Modern American Culture</i> , Cambridge, Mass.: The Belknap Press, Harvard University, 1992, p. 53-55) After a crushing defeat at the hands of the German army, the group quickly disbanded. Although all of these prophecies were misguided, it would be a mistake to doubt the sincerity of the individuals.
1420	The Taborites of Czechoslovakia predicted every city would be annihilated by fire. Only five mountain strongholds would be saved.
1490 - 1500	<p>Botticelli was convinced that he was living in the times of the Tribulation (the pre-apocalyptic period described in the Bible during which the untrue would suffer great disasters) because a fanatical preacher named Savonarola had arrived in Florence in 1490.</p> <p>At first, he was seen as a prophet for having predicted the Italian War of 1494-1498 and talked the French king out of invading the city. Savonarola was a pimp like that. He sought to purge Florence of its artistic vanity and wealth by making its residents burn their luxuries and paintings.</p> <p>Savonarola was eventually executed, but Botticelli's inscription predicts an apocalypse in the 16th century and has been the key to reading <i>The Mystical Nativity</i> not only as a scene of salvation and goodness but one that foreshadows the second coming of Christ and has dark imagery such as demons fleeing to the Underworld.</p>
	 <p><i>The Mystical Nativity</i> was the only painting Botticelli signed and with it wrote an inscription that said: "This picture, at the end of the year 1500, in the troubles of Italy, I Alessandro painted. In the half time after the time, during the fulfillment of the eleventh chapter of St. John in the second woe of the apocalypse."</p>
1496	1496: This was approximately 1500 years after the birth of Jesus. Some mystics in the 15th century predicted that the millennium would begin during this year.
1528- 05-27	Hans Hut predicted the end would occur on this day.
1524- 02-20	Johannes Stöfler believed that a planetary alignment in Pisces was seen by this astrologer as a sign of the Millennium.
1524 - 1526	Muntzer, a leader of German peasants, announced that the return of Christ was near. After he and his men destroyed the high and mighty, the Lord would return. This belief led to an uneven battle with government troops where he was strategically out-numbered. Muntzer claimed to have a vision from God where the Lord promised that He would catch the cannon balls of the enemy in the sleeves of His cloak. The vision turned


	out to be false when Muntzer and his followers were mowed down by cannon fire.
1524-02-01	Many Astrologers predicted the world would end by a flood starting in London based on calculations made the previous June.
1524	<p>Many astrologers predicted the imminent end of the world due to a world wide flood. A respected German scholar and priest, Johannes Stoeffler, predicted in 1499 that the world would be flooded again because all six of the planets known then would be in conjunction in the constellation of Pisces.</p> <p>Since Pisces is represented by a fish, Stoeffler assumed it meant water would be responsible for killing all of the Earth's inhabitants. Perfectly reasonable.</p> <p>Because he was well-respected, people listened to his prediction and braced themselves for the second Great Flood.</p> <p>English astrologers set the date for February 1, 1524. People sold their waterfront property even if they lost profit and an elevated fortress was built at the Priory Church of St. Bartholomew the Great with two months worth of necessities.</p> <p>Boat builders became filthy rich as families commissioned arks to be built to protect themselves when the flood arrived.</p> <p>The craziest part, and definitely the one who believed Stoeffler the most was German count named Von Igleheim who actually constructed a luxury, three-story ark for his friends and family.</p> <p>On February 1st 20,000 Londoners left their homes to get to higher ground and await the rain. Nothing happened and they all went back to their houses.</p> <p>In Europe, however, it began to rain at dawn. A crowd around von Igleheim's ark became panicked and tried to get onto it, killing many in the stampede.</p> <p>When he refused to let them on, they dragged him out of the ark and stoned him to death.</p>
1525	Thomas Müntzer predicted that this year would mark the beginning of the Millennium, according to this Anabaptist.
1528	Revised date from Johannes Stöffler after his 1524 prediction failed to come true.

1533	Melchior Hoffman, an Anabaptist prophet, predicted that Jesus' return would happen a millennium and a half after the nominal date of his execution in Strasbourg. He claimed that 144,000 people would be saved, while the rest of the world would be consumed by fire. The New Jerusalem was expected to be established in Strasbourg, Germany. He was arrested and died in a Strasbourg jail.
1533-10-19	Michael Stifel, a mathematician calculated that the Judgement Day would begin at 8:00am on this day.
1534-04-05	Jan Matthys predicted that the Apocalypse would take place on this day and only the city of Münster would be spared.
1534	A repeat of the Muntzer affair occurred a few years late. This time Jan. Matthys took over the city of



	Munster. The City was to be the only one spared destruction. The inhabitants of Munster, chased out by Matthys and his men, regrouped and lay siege to the city. Within a year everyone in the city was dead.
1555	Around the year 1400, Pierre d'Ailly a French theologian, wrote that 6845 years of human history had already passed, and the end of the world would be in the 7000th year.
1572	Benedictus Aretius of Berne (1505-1547) calculated that 1260 years added to the year Constantine made Christianity the official religion (312+1260=1572) should be the year. (Luther Martin, Date Setters, Guardian of Truth, Sept. 15, 1994)
1585	Michael Servetus wrote in his book The Restoration of Christianity, the Spanish born reformer claimed that the Devil's reign in this world began in 325 AD, at the Council of Nicea, and will last for 1260 years, thus ending in 1585.
1588	Regiomontanus predicted the end of the world this year.
1600	Martin Luther predicted the end of the world would occur no later than 1600.
1621	Soon after 1621; Sir Henry Finch; (Book: The World's Great Restauration or The Calling of the Jews) Peter Toon noted that 80 books were published in England by 1649
1624-02-01	The same astrologers who predicted the deluge of February 1, 1524 recalculated the date to February 1, 1624 after their first prophecy failed.
1648	<i>Sabbatai Zevi</i> , a rabbi from Smyrna, Turkey, using the kabbalah figured that the Messiah would come in this year.
1650 - 1660	<i>The Fifth Monarchists</i> , a group of radical Christians predicted the final apocalyptic battle and the destruction of the Antichrist were to take place between 1655 and 1657. <i>The Fifth Monarchy Men</i> looked for Jesus to establish a theocracy. They took up arms and tried to seize England by force. The movement died when the British monarchy was restored in 1660.
1654	Helisaeus Roeslin, a physician, made a prediction that the world would end this year based on a nova that occurred in 1572.
1656	Conversion and Return of the Jews; Mary Cary; mentioned in <i>Armageddon Now!</i> by Dwight Wilson
1656	Some Christians believed the world would end this year as 1656 is the number of years between Creation and the Great Flood in the bible.
1658	Christopher Columbus claimed that the world was created in 5343 BCE, and would last 7000 years. Assuming no year zero, that means the end would come in 1658.
	<p><i>"Would you rather have butter or guns? Preparedness makes us powerful. Butter merely makes us fat." Hermann Goering</i></p>
1660	Joseph Mede claimed that the Antichrist appeared in 456, and the end would come in 1660.
1666	To many Christians the presence of 666 in the date led to superstitious fears of the end of the world. Sabbatai Zevi, following his failed prediction of 1648, recalculated the end of the earth in 1666. And to the citizens of London, 1666 was not a banner year. A bubonic plague outbreak killed 100,000 and the Great Fire of London struck the same year. The world seemed at an end to most Londoners. The fact that the year ended with the Beast's number (666), didn't help matters either.
1669	The Old Believers in Russia believed that the end of the world would occur in this year. 20 thousand burned themselves to death between 1669 and 1690 to protect themselves from the Antichrist.

1673	William Aspinwall, a Fifth Monarchist claimed the Millennium would begin by this year.
1688	John Napier, a mathematician calculated the end of the world would be this year based on calculations from the Book of Revelation.
1689	Benjamin Keach, a 17 th century Baptist, predicted the end of the world for this year.
1689	Pierre Jurieu, considered a prophet, predicted that Judgement Day would occur this year.
1694	John Mason, an Anglican priest and Johann Heinrich Alsted predicted the Millennium would begin by this year. And Johann Jacob Zimmermann believed that Jesus would return and the world would end this year.
1697	Cotton Mather a Puritan minister predicted the world would end this year. After the prediction failed, he revised the date of the End two more times.

1715	Christ's coming; Isaac Newton, a note in his research on the Law of Gravity (Luther Martin, Date Setters, Guardian of Truth, Sept. 15, 1994) Coming of Christ; William Whiston, who succeeded Newton as the Professor of Mathematics at Cambridge; also trans. Josephus removed from his professorship (Luther Martin, Date Setters, Guardian of Truth, Sept. 15, 1994)
1716	Revised prediction from Cotton Mather after his 1697 prediction failed to come true
1719-04-05	Jacob Bernoulli, a mathematician, predicted a comet would destroy the earth on this day.
1736-10	British theologian and mathematician William Whiston predicted a great flood similar to Noah's and a comet hitting the earth for OCT-13 or 16 of this year.

1757	Emanuel Swedenborg claimed that the Last Judgement occurred in the spiritual world this year.
1795-11-19	Nathaniel Brassey Halhed, while campaigning for Richard Brothers' release, Halhead proclaimed that the world would end on this day.
1780	The sky turning dark during the day was interpreted as a sign of the end times for New England residents. Historically the primary cause of the event is now believed to have been a combination of smoke from forest fires, a thick fog, and cloud cover.
1783	On JUN-08, a volcanic eruption in southern Iceland started. It pumped massive amounts of toxic dust, sulphur dioxide and fluorine into the atmosphere. Cattle died, crops failed, and about one quarter of the island's population died of starvation. By the end of June, poisonous clouds had reached England and much of Europe. Boats had to stay in harbor because they could not navigate. There was massive loss of life in England, particularly among farm workers. Many predicted that the end of the world was imminent.
1789	Pierre d'Ailly, 14th century Cardinal, believed 1789 would bring the coming of the Antichrist.
1792 - 1794	The Shakers predicted the world would end in both 1792 then 1794.

1794	<p>Charles Wesley</p> <p>Charles Wesley, one of the founders of the Methodist church believed that the world was going to end in 1794. This view concurred with that of the Shakers who also predicted that year as the end. Despite his error, Charles' brother John also later made a prediction of the end times; John predicted that 1836 would be the year that the Great Beast would come to earth, marking the beginning of the end.</p> <p>Interesting Fact: Despite being a founding member of Methodism, Charles Wesley begged an Anglican minister to bury him in an Anglican graveyard, stating: "Sir, whatever the world may say of me, I have lived, and I die, a member of the Church of England."</p>	
1705 – 1708	Camisards one of several Camisard prophets predicted the end of the world would occur in either 1705, 1706 or 1708.	
1700 – 1734	Nicholas of Cusa, a Cardinal, predicted the end would occur between 1700 and 1734.	
1794	Charles Wesley, one of the founders of Methodism, thought that Doomsday would occur in this year.	
1793 – 1795	Richard Brothers, a retired sailor, stated the Millennium would begin between 1793 and 1795. He was eventually committed to an insane asylum.

1806 - 1809	In Leeds, England in 1806 a hen, 'The Prophet Hen of Leeds', began laying eggs on which the phrase "Christ is coming" was written. Eventually it was discovered to be a hoax. The hoaxster, Mary Bateman, who specialized in fortune telling, had written on the eggs in a corrosive ink so as to etch the eggs, and reinserted the eggs back into the hen. The uproar she created ended when she was caught forcing an egg into the hen's oviduct by an unannounced visitor. Mary later was hanged for poisoning a wealthy client.	
1814- 10-19	<p>Joanna Southcott, a 64-year-old self-proclaimed English mystic, claimed she was pregnant with the Christ child, hailing the end of the world, on 19 October, 1814 and that Christ would be born on Christmas Day, 1814. The world didn't end on that date, but two months later it <i>did</i> end for Joanna who died, the day of her 'birth' prediction and an autopsy proved she was not pregnant. Her followers kept her body for some time in the hopes that she would raise herself from the dead. They finally handed her over to authorities when she began to decay.</p> <p>Interesting Fact: Joanna left behind a sealed box which she claims contained a series of prophecies. The box is not to be opened until 24 Anglican Bishops gather together for that purpose. Will the secret of Joanna's box every be revealed?</p>	
1830	Margaret McDonald, a Christian prophetess, predicted that Robert Owen would be the Antichrist. Owen helped found New Harmony, IN.

<p>1831</p>	<p>The Great Disappointment</p> <p>Between the years of 1831 and 1841, William Miller (a Baptist minister), predicted the return of Jesus and the end of the world based on prophecies in the Book of Daniel (Daniel 8:14). "My principles in brief, are, that Jesus Christ will come again to this earth, cleanse, purify, and take possession of the same, with all the saints, sometime between March 21, 1843 and March 21, 1844." The day came and went and the Millerites kept their faith. After further discussion, the date of the end of the world was changed to April 18th. Again the day came and went. Again the date was changed – this time to October 22, 1844. Miller continued to wait for the end until his death in 1849.</p> <p>Interesting Fact: The Millerite religious movement eventually became the Seventh-day Adventist Church. They believe that the prediction was correct, but that it referred to an event in Heaven not on earth. They continue to believe that to this day. Members of the Bahá'í Faith also believe the prediction – they think it referred to the coming of a forerunner of their own religion, the Bab.</p>	
<p>1832</p>	<p>1832?: Joseph Smith (1805-1844) was the founder of the Church of Christ, which became the <u>Restorationist movement</u> after many schisms. It now includes <i>The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints</i> -- a.k.a. the Mormons, and about a hundred other denominations and sects. He heard a voice while praying. He wrote, in <i>Doctrines and Covenants</i> section 130:</p> <p>14: "I was once praying very earnestly to know the time of the coming of the Son of Man, when I heard a voice repeat the following:"</p> <p>15: "Joseph, my son, if thou livest until thou art eighty-five years old, thou shalt see the face of the Son of Man; therefore let this suffice, and trouble me no more on this matter."</p> <p>16: "I was left thus, without being able to decide whether this coming referred to the beginning of the millennium or to some previous appearing, or whether I should die and thus see his face."</p> <p>17: "I believe the coming of the Son of Man will not be any sooner than that time." ¹⁴</p> <p>The year in which this event occurred is not recorded. However, one commentator suggested 1832 or earlier. ¹⁶ Smith is later recorded as having said:</p> <p>"I prophesy in the name of the Lord God, and let it be written--the Son of Man will not come in the clouds of heaven till I am eighty-five years old." ¹⁷</p> <p>Smith would have reached the age of 85 during 1890. Unfortunately, by that year, Smith had been dead for almost a half century, having been assassinated by a mob.</p>	
<p>1836</p>	<p>John Wesley the founder of the Methodist Church, foresaw the Millennium beginning this year.</p> <p>While Johann Albrecht Bengel (1687-1752) divided 666 by 42 (months) and came out that each month = 15-6/7 years. Came up with date for the Millennium to begin, using this formula</p>	
<p>1843</p>	<p>The first of two years that preacher Harriet Livermore, predicted the world would end.</p>	
<p>1843 - 1844</p>	<p>William Miller, New England farmer, was the founder of an end-times movement that was so prominent it received its own name—Millerism and founder of the Millerites. From his studies of the Bible, Miller determined that the second coming would happen sometime between 1843-1844.</p> <p>A spectacular meteor shower in 1833 gave the movement a good push forward. The build up of anticipation continued until March 21, 1844, when Miller's one year time table ran out. Some followers set another date of Oct 22, 1844. This too failed.</p>	

1843, Apr 28 Although it was not officially endorsed by their leadership, many Millerites expected the Second Coming to occur on this day.
 1843, Dec 31 Many Millerites expected Jesus would return at the end of 1843.
 1844, Mar 21 William Miller predicted Christ would return on this day.
 1844, Oct 22 After Christ did not return on Mar 21, 1844, William Miller then revised his prediction to 22 October 1844, claiming to have miscalculated Scripture. The realization that the predictions were incorrect resulted in the Great Disappointment.
 One follower described the days after the failed predictions, "The world made merry over the old Prophet's predicament. The taunts and jeers of the 'scoffers' were well-nigh unbearable."



1847 Harriet Livermore issued her 2nd prediction of the end of the world.

1847-08-07 George Rapp, the founder of the Harmony Society, preached that Jesus would return in his lifetime, even as he lay dying on Aug 7, 1847.

1850 Ellen White, founder of the Seven Day Adventists movement, made many predictions of the timing of the end of the world. All failed. On 1850-JUN-27 she prophesied that only a few months remained before the end. She wrote: "My accompanying angel said, 'Time is almost finished. Get ready, get ready, get ready.' ...now time is almost finished...and what we have been years learning, they will have to learn in a few months."

1853 - 1856 Many people thought the Crimean War was the Battle of Armageddon.

1856 At Ellen White's last prediction (1856 or later), she said that she was shown in a vision the fate of believers who attended the 1856 SDA conference. She wrote "I was shown the company present at the Conference. Said the angel: 'Some food for worms, some subjects of the seven last plagues, some will be alive and remain upon the earth to be translated at the coming of Jesus.'" That is, some of the attendees would die of normal diseases; some would die from plagues at the last days, others would still be alive when Jesus came. "By the early 1900s all those who attended the conference had passed away, leaving the Church with the dilemma of trying to figure out how to explain away such a prominent prophetic failure."

1859 Rev Thomas Parker, a Massachusetts Minister, looked for the millennium to start about 1859.




1862 John Cumming, a Scottish clergyman stated it was 6000 years since Creation in 1862, and that the world would end.



1863 John Wroe, the founder of the Christian Israelite Church calculated that the Millennium would begin this year.

1873 Jonas Wendell, in 1870, published his views in the booklet entitled The Present Truth, or Meat in Due Season concluding that the Second Advent was sure to occur in 1873.

1874 The first prediction of the end of the world from the Bible Student movement started by Charles Taze Russell.
 The newly formed Seventh Day Adventists, a group founded by former Millerites, also predicted the Second Coming would be in this year.

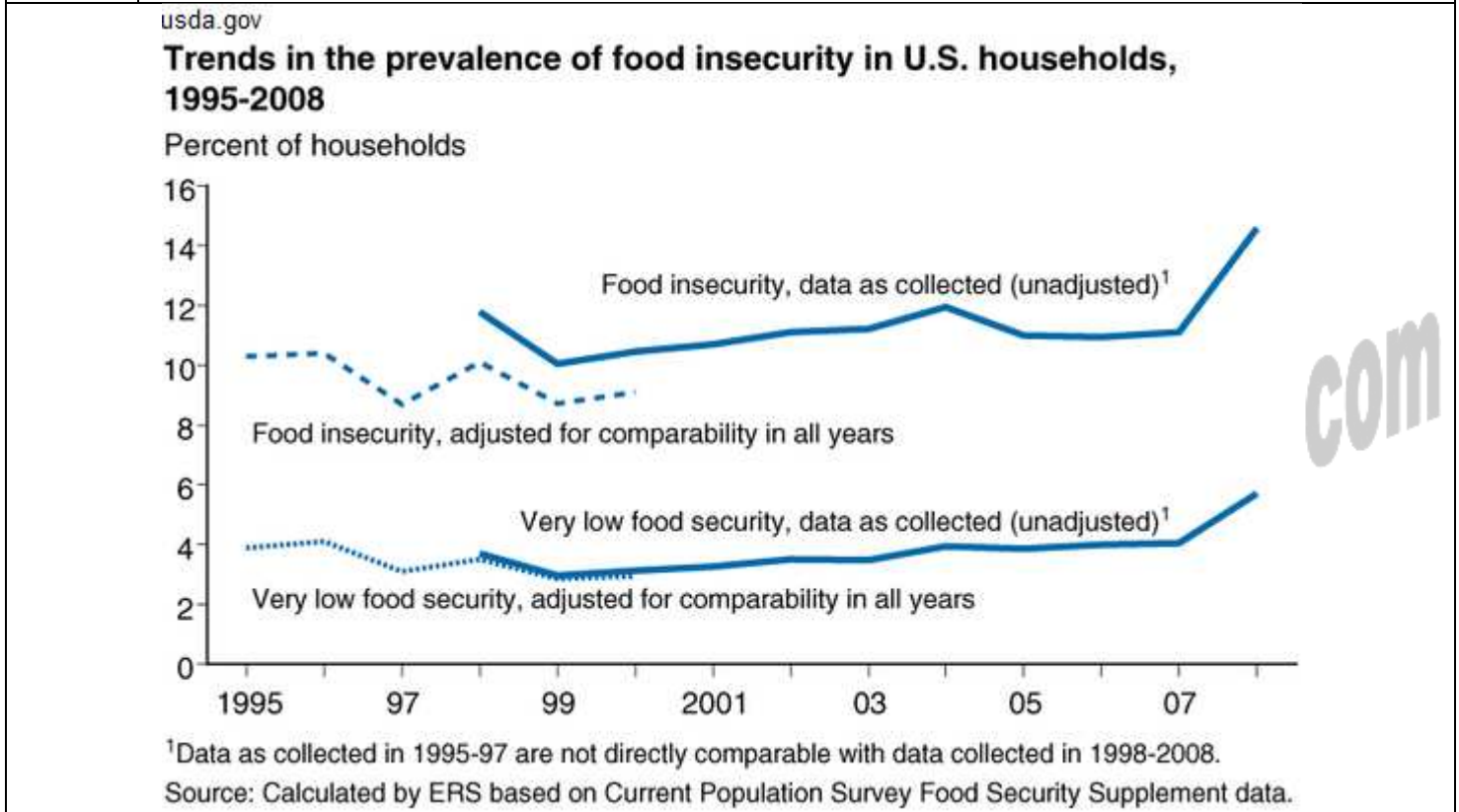
1878 The second prediction of the end of the world from the Bible Student movement.

<p>1910</p>	<p>Halley's Comet</p> <p>In 1881, an astronomer discovered through spectral analysis that comet tails include a deadly gas called cyanogen (related, as the name implies, to cyanide). This was of only passing interest until someone realized that Earth would pass through the tail of Halley's comet in 1910. Would everyone on the planet be bathed in deadly toxic gas? That was the speculation reprinted on the front pages of "The New York Times" and other newspapers, resulting in a widespread panic across the United States and abroad. <p>1914</p>	<p>The Bible Student movement reported that "...the battle of the great day of God Almighty... The date of the close of that "battle" is definitely marked in Scripture as October 1914. It is already in progress, its beginning dating from October, 1874."</p>	
<p>1914</p>	<p>Jehovah’s Witness Predictions</p> <p>Charles Russell, after being exposed to the teachings of William Miller, founded his own organization - the Jehovah's Witnesses.</p> <p>The Jehovah’s Witness religion has made a number of predictions about the end of the world. The first was 1914 – they based their prediction on prophecies from the Book of Daniel. After the end did not come, they changed the meaning of the prediction and stated that it was the date that Jesus would begin to rule invisibly (yes – invisibly). In 1920 all earthly governments would disappear, with worldwide anarchy prevailing.

1925 Joseph F. Watchtower magazine predicted: *"The year 1925 is a date definitely and clearly marked in the Scriptures, even more clearly than that of 1914; but it would be presumptuous on the part of any faithful follower of the Lord to assume just what the Lord is going to do during that year."*

1975 looked likely as it was computed as the 6000th anniversary of the creation of Adam in the Garden of Eden in 4026 BCE. They interpreted Psalms 90:10 as defining the length of a generation to be 80 years. Since 1914 plus 80 equals 1994, they predicted Armageddon would occur around that year. The latest estimate was 6000 years after the creation of Eve, for which no date can be determined with any accuracy.

1914, 1918, 1920, 1925, 1941, 1975 and 1994 are other dates that the Watchtower Society predicted.

1935-02-13 Margaret Rowen, a Seventh-day Adventist, the angel Gabriel appeared before her in a vision and told her that the world would end at midnight on this date.

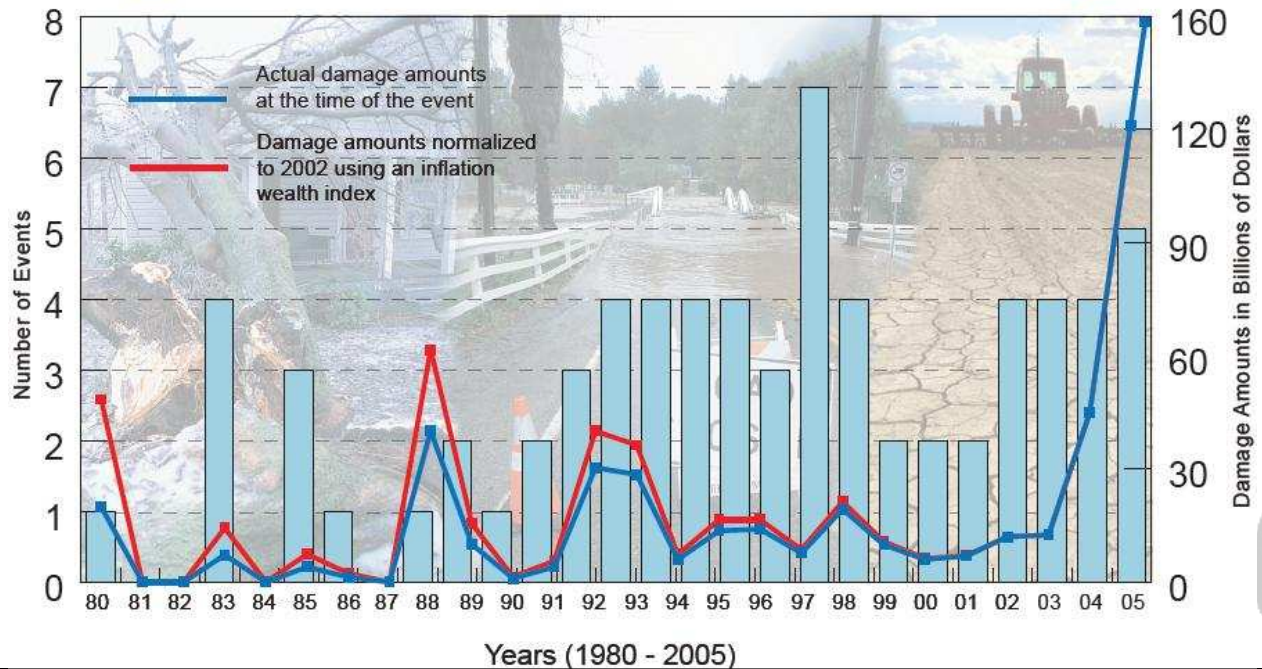
1935-09 Wilbur Glenn Voliva, an evangelist announced that "the world is going to go 'puff' and disappear in September, 1935.

1954-12-21	Dorothy Martin, the leader of a UFO cult called Brotherhood of the Seven Rays, claimed the world was to be destroyed by terrible flooding on this date. The fallout of the group after the prediction failed was the basis for the 1956 book <i>When Prophecy Fails</i> .
1957-04	The <i>Watchtower</i> magazine, quoted a pastor from California, Mihran Ask, as saying in 1957-JAN that <i>"Sometime between April 16 and 23, 1957, Armageddon will sweep the world! Millions of persons will perish in its flames and the land will be scorched."</i>
1959-04-22	Believing that the end of time was imminent, Mrs. Florence Houteff and her council began a campaign to evangelize across the U.S., Canada, the West Indies and western Asia. The campaign included publicity events such as equipping cars with signs that read, "Hear Ye The Rod," a Biblical reference (Micah 6:9) to "The Shepherd's Rod" Message. The cars also were outfitted with loudspeakers to broadcast the Rod message to passersby.
1960	Piazz Smyth, a past astronomer royal of Scotland, wrote a book circa 1860 titled <i>"Our Inheritance in the Great Pyramid."</i> It was responsible for spreading the belief in pyramidology throughout the world. This is the belief that secrets are hidden in the dimensions of the great pyramids. He concluded from his research that the millennium would start before the end of 1960.
1961	According to the 1997-JUN-24 issue of <i>Sun Magazine</i> Pope John XXIII predicted in 1961 that Doomsday will begin with the detonation of an atomic bomb in a major European city by a Libyan terrorist group. This will trigger a massive six-month war that will cause the deaths of millions of people.
1962-02-04	Jeanne Dixon, a psychic predicted a planetary alignment on this day was to bring destruction to the world on this day.

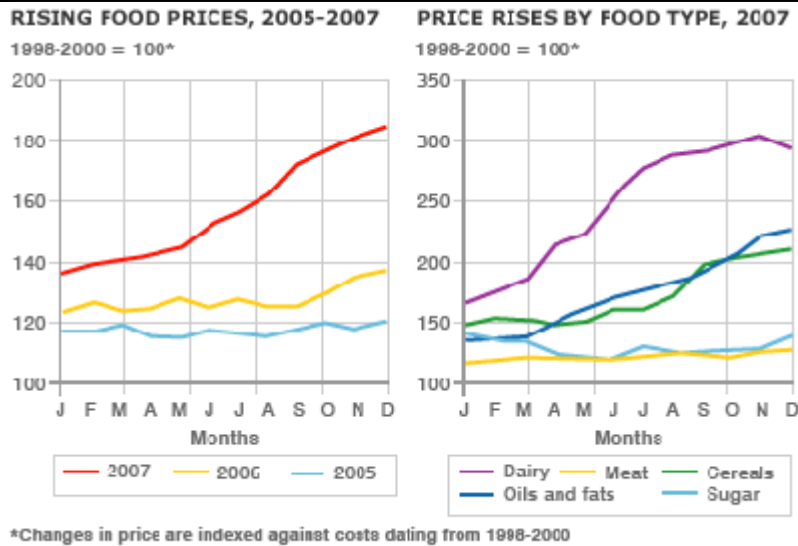

After the date passed, they said that the delay was only because the "consciousness of the human race was not quite right..."

1982 It was all going to end in 1982 on March 10, when the planets lined up and created magnetic forces that would bring Armageddon to the earth.

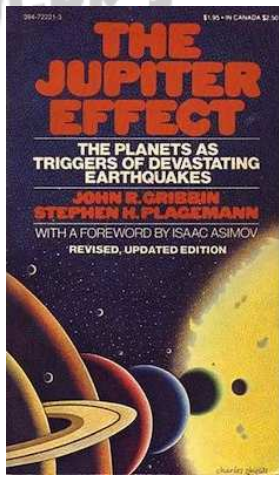
In 1974, John Gribbin, who had a Ph.D in astrophysics, and Stephen Plagemann published *The Jupiter Effect*. In the book, the two authors claim that on March 10, 1982, all nine of the planets would align, resulting in a gravitational pull that would cause a shitload of natural disasters.

"Scientists are forecasting that soon our solar system will experience some unique and sobering events. This forecast concerning 1982 comes from the scientific investigations of astronomers and is in no way related to astrology and fortune telling. The news is quoted from the September 16, 1974 edition of "Newsweek" magazine, science section.

These are the conclusions of John Gribbin, science editor of "Nature" magazine, and of Stephen Plagemann of NASA's Goddard Space Center in Maryland. These reputable scientists are pointing out that in the latter part of 1982 there will take place an event unique in our solar system. At that time all nine planets will be on the same side of the sun. That happens once every 179 years, but in 1982 the nine planets will not only be on the same side of the sun, but in perfect alignment.

"Newsweek" referred to this situation as "An Apocalyptic Prediction:!" In the book that these men have co-authored, "The Jupiter Effect", they point out that, just as the moon affects earth tides by its gravitational pull, so do the planets affect each other, and particularly Jupiter, because of its great size. This has been linked to the earthquake frequency on our planet earth.

What will happen when all the planets come into one line and exert a united gravitational pull on our earth? These scientists speak of eight probable effects: 1) A disturbed magnetic activity in the sun, producing huge firestorms; 2) That the ionosphere of earth will be changed; 3) That radio and television communications will



be disrupted; 4) That there will be weird lighting effects from aurora borealis; 5) There will be vast changes in wind patterns; 6) Rainfall and temperature patterns will change; 7) Earth's rotation, and the length of the days may change; 8) Many earthquakes will occur. "There will be many earthquakes, large and small... and one region where one of the greatest fault systems lies today, under great strain, long overdue for a giant leap forward, and just waiting for the necessary kick, is California."

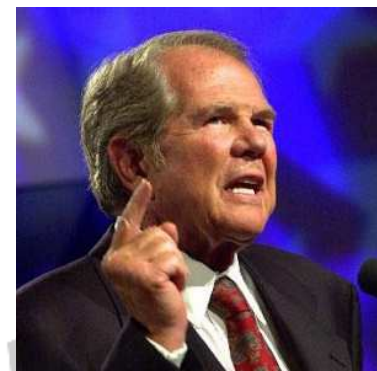
This is the frightening, apocalyptic vision of the scientists as quoted in "Newsweek." (Evangelical Tract Distributors, Edmonton, Alta., Canada)"

Unsurprisingly, the day came and went and nothing catastrophic happened. Years later, Gribbin would regret writing the book, saying, "I don't like it, and I'm sorry I ever had anything to do with it."

1982

In late 1976 Pat Robertson predicted that the end of the world was coming in October or November 1982.

In May 1980, televangelist and Christian Coalition founder Pat Robertson startled and alarmed many when — contrary to Matthew 24:36 ("No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven...") he informed his "700 Club" TV show audience around the world that he knew when the world would end. "I guarantee you by the end of 1982 there is going to be a judgment on the world," Robertson said.



Televangelist, ex-Baptist minister and failed Republican candidate for the 1988 presidential election, Pat Robertson always has a prediction to make and commentary of the utmost insensitivity on any disaster that occurs (Check out [The 10 Craziest Things Pat Robertson Has Ever Said](#))

In 1980 he said on *The 700 Club* (a program named after the approximate age and/or weight of anyone who watches it) "I guarantee by the end of 1982 there is going to be a judgment on this world."



He believed that as of 1980, the Anti-Christ was about 27 years old and that Armageddon would start in 1982 followed by 7 "nightmare years" of intense suffering. Which is awesome. I mean, the Biblical apocalypse is pretty epic.











The "nightmare years" according to the book of revelations include 4 horsemen, Satan coming back to Earth, zombies, a *dragon* (yes, a *dragon*) and some other stuff that would actually be pretty damn awesome to see in real life before dying a terrible, terrible death at the hands of some creature that would look like a main character from Hellraiser. Or maybe we'd just get the traditional Satan, who knows? Either way, it would be exciting.




In 2006 he predicted a tsunami would hit America.

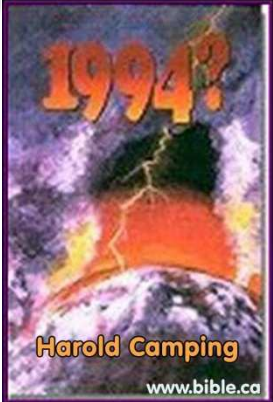

Their efforts were successful, although four group members had committed suicide in previous days.</p> <p>Lee Jang Rim was jailed for two years after embezzling 4.4 million dollars 10,000 of his cult followers. 1997-03	Hale-Bopp Comet & Heaven's Gate The comet Hale-Bopp was visible to the naked eye for a record 18 months. Amateur astronomer, Chuck Shramek "observed" a companion object following the comet. He then called the Art Bell radio show to report his findings. This led many to believe a variety of "end of the world" theories. The internet helped spread the word even faster. The Heaven's Gate cult felt this was their signal to commit mass suicide in March of 1997. The cult believed the companion object was a spaceship coming to pick them up only to be reached by leaving their Earthly vessels behind.



When amateur astronomer Chuck Shramek took a fuzzy CCD image of the comet Hale-Bopp, which was set to reappear in 1997, he mistakenly observed that a Saturn-like object was trailing behind it. The observation reached message boards on the early, pre-YouTube Internet and spread, making UFO enthusiasts predict that an alien spacecraft was trailing the comet.



The closeness of the comet's appearance to the new millennium led religious cults like Heaven's Gate to see it as a sign of the apocalypse.

Later it was discovered that two astronomers from the University of Hawaii had actually taken the photo and Shramek's had been altered to add the object. Oh, how gullible people were before the magics of social media and Photoshop were well known. I'll be right back, I need to drink my Acai, wheatgrass and bacon shot.

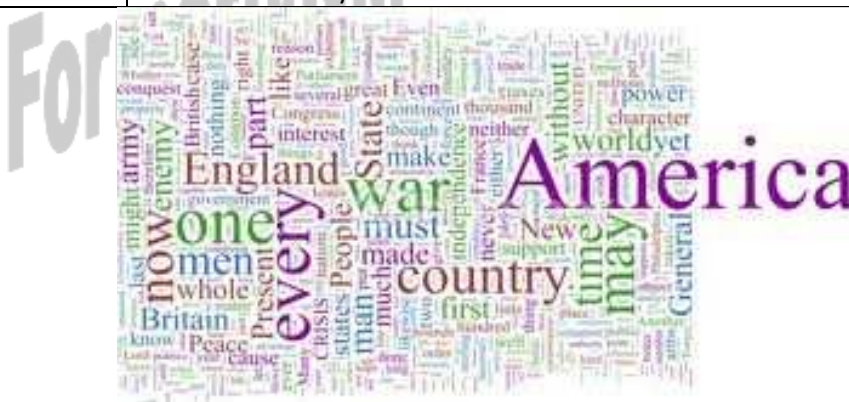
Heaven's Gate, 1997

When comet Hale-Bopp appeared in 1997, rumors surfaced that an alien spacecraft was following the comet — covered up, of course, by NASA and the astronomical community. Though the claim was refuted by astronomers (and could be refuted by anyone with a good telescope), the rumors were publicized on Art Bell's paranormal radio talk show "Coast to Coast AM." These claims inspired Marshall Applewhite, leader of the Heaven's Gate cult, in San Diego, claimed that a spacecraft was trailing the Comet Hale-Bopp and argued that suicide was "the only way to evacuate this Earth" so that the cult members' souls could board the supposed craft and be taken to another "level of existence above human". Applewhite and 30+ of his followers committed mass suicide. UFO cult named Heaven's Gate to conclude that the world would end soon.

The *Vortex of the Star of David* religious sect of Luskville, Quebec was quoted (2) as predicting the end of the world on Saturday, MAR-8. A father, Jean Leon Marcoux, was interviewed; he was worried because his children will be visiting their mother at the sect's commune on that weekend. He approached the Quebec police but was unable to get them to take any action. A spokesperson for the sect stated that they do not have a doomsday scenario.

1997-APR-10: Dan Millar, of Surrey, BC, Canada and Bob Wadsworth of the *Biblical Astronomy* newsletter are two religious researchers. They are following the age-old tradition of looking for signs in the heavens for the arrival of the Antichrist, return of Christ, etc. Ancient prophecies told of heavenly events and even a cross in the sky in advance of momentous developments. Millar and Wadsworth have predicted the arrival of the Antichrist on APR-10. Dan suggested that we watch news from the Vatican and from Jerusalem on that day, because he expects some sort of coup by the Antichrist. They intersect between the eyes of the Medusa head that Perseus is holding in his left hand. "Algol" means "Demon Star" in Arabic. The head is known as Rosh Satan (the head of Satan) in Hebrew. There will be one further heavenly sign: on the evening of APR-10, there will be a lunar occultation of the star Aldebaran in the constellation Taurus.</p>
<p>1997-06-20</p>	<p>According to Weekly World News of 1997-NOV-18, the CIA has caught a space alien who had crash-landed on JUN-20 in a New Mexico desert. He is from a species that is considerably more developed, both mentally and spiritually, than mankind. A number of groups claimed that activation of the Large Hadron Collider experiment would bring about the end of the world through the production of planet-eating micro black holes or strangelets. Similar claims were made about 2010, March 30, when the collider reached maximum energy.

The Large Hadron Collider that stretches 27 km between France and Switzerland is the largest particle accelerator ever built and was set to be turned on on September 10, 2008 to recreate the Big Bang. Some speculate it will create a Black Hole that will destroy the earth and swallow the universe.



On 10 September 2008, the proton beams were successfully circulated in the main ring of the LHC for the first time, but 9 days later operations were halted due to a [magnet quench incident](#) resulting from an electrical fault. The following helium gas explosion damaged over 50 [superconducting magnets](#) and their mountings, and contaminated the [vacuum pipe](#). On 20 November 2009 they were successfully circulated again, with the first recorded proton-proton [collisions](#) occurring 3 days later at the injection energy of 450 GeV per beam. On 30 March 2010, the first collisions took place between two 3.5 TeV beams, setting the current world record for the highest-energy man-made particle collisions, and the LHC began its planned research program.

The LHC will operate at 4 TeV per beam until the end of 2012, 0.5 TeV higher than 2010 and 2011. It will then go into shutdown for 20 months for upgrades to allow full energy operation (7 TeV per beam), with reopening planned for late 2014.

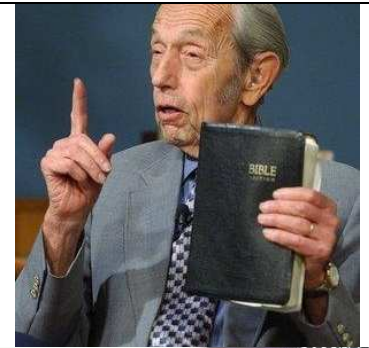
Harold Camping owns 55 radio stations and advertised on 6000 billboards in the USA. After his first prediction of the end of the world failed in 1994, Camping refused to accept his condemnation as a false prophet and is at it a second time!



California-based Family Radio host Harold Camping is back with another prediction! Unlike most radio talk show hosts, he doesn't just predict game scores or celebrity hookups, no, Mr. Harold Camping predicts apocalypses (apocali?).

It's fair to say most people deserve a second chance, but considering that the 89-year-old has been wrong about the world ending before, it's shocking that people *still* believe him this time.

Here's his reasoning:

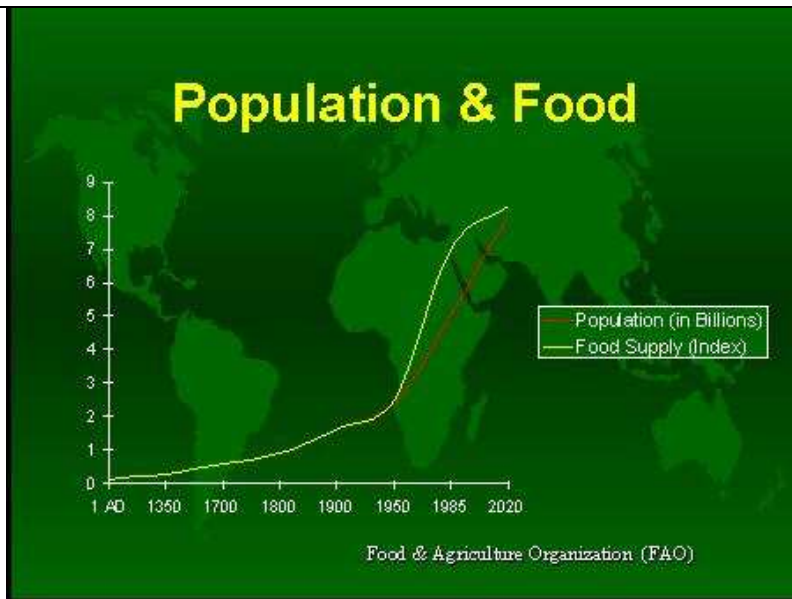

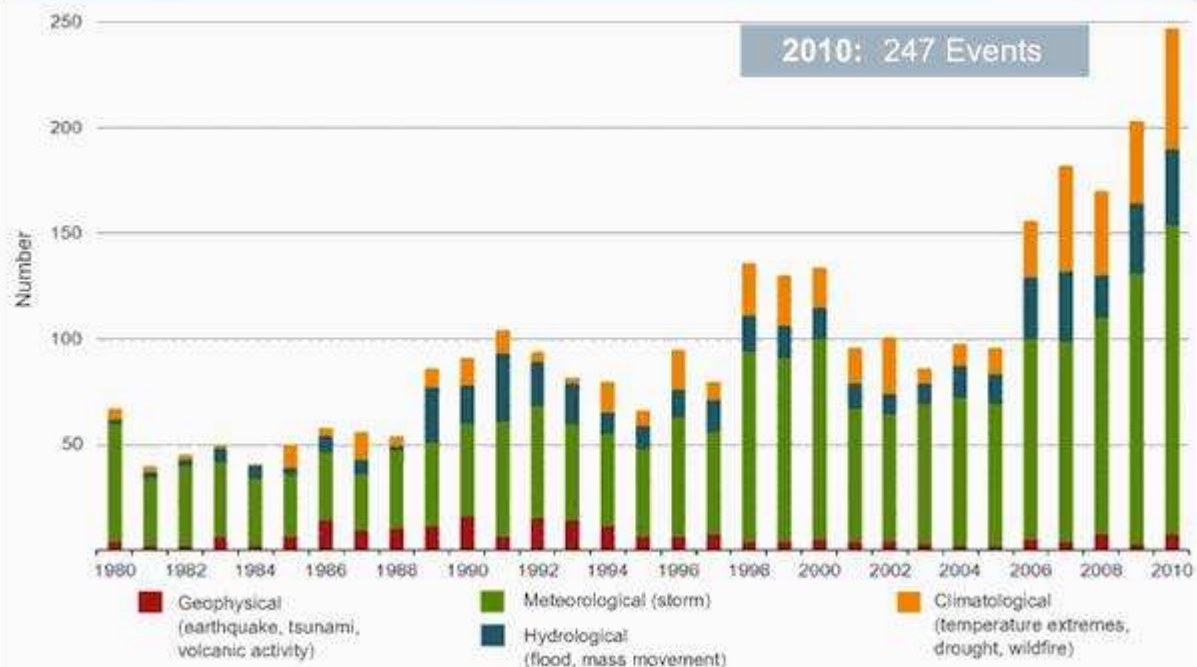

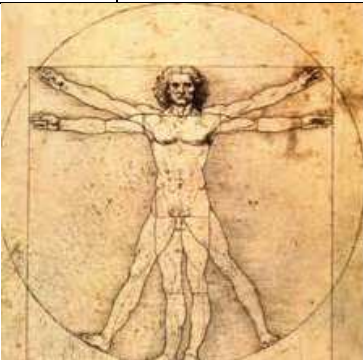

Why Prepare?

- Physical age of the physical components of various western world infrastructures (electrical GRID, bridges, dams, water (drinking, storm & waste))
- Water reservoirs are at capacity; many are seeing lower water levels; Aquifers are drying up



- A "consume and toss", commercial driven economy with a shift to "projective" budgeting vs. "break even" budgeting at all costs mentality

- We don't have enough fertile farm land to grow enough crops to feed the world population and that population is growing every day
- Collective abuse of discovered chemicals resulting in an "unhealthily" environment as well as "super bugs", plagues and other ailments
- Many bacteria and insects are developing immunities to our chemicals resulting in crop diseases and human illnesses
- Science has identified thousands more dangerous tectonic faults, many in major population and industry areas, around the globe
- Mass Debt (confusion between "Need" and "Want") on national and individual levels, coupled with the 'entitlement' mentality

Each day, each season, brought the possibility of having no water, no food, no medicinal herbs, and no shelter. Storing as much food as possible, yes, stockpiling!, wasn't radical, it was sensible. The only alternative to preparedness was death.

Fast forward thousands of years, and self-sufficiency, by and large, is a thing of the past. We have forgotten essential, practical survival skills. Why take the trouble to grow your own food when there's a grocery store on every corner? The produce department displays not just one variety of apples but a dozen, all shiny clean and not a worm in sight. Discount stores offer shoes and clothing at a price much lower than anything handmade. Most of us revel in the quality and variety of goods that are so easily accessible, but will this era of plenty last indefinitely?

Additionally, many of the skills of our forefathers have been lost. Who among us knows how to make shoes by hand or spin wool into thread? Knowledge, as well, has been lost, often within just one generation. A farmer or an ardent gardener discovers that his or her children just aren't interested in the details and nuances of growing food. Knowledge accumulated over generations is lost forever when that older generation passes on.

It really is no wonder that preppers seem out of step with most everyone around us. There are

obvious, ominous storm clouds on the horizon, and to us, it just makes sense to stock up on groceries, learn long-forgotten skills, and make plans for any number of emergencies.

If you really stop and think about it, most people are Preppers, at least in some small way. How so? Most of us have insurance for our health, home, vehicles and major “toys” and possessions. Insurance is in case the worst happens is it not? Ha – a Prepper. Many country and northern folk have alternative energy and food stores because winter storms often take out electricity, phone service and the ability to travel safely for days and even weeks. Again – Preppers. If you have a first aid kit in your home, boat, auto or RV you are preparing for the chance you might need it. A Prepper. If you live in an area that is prone to earthquakes, tornados, hurricanes, avalanches, mud slides or floods you no doubt have some kind of plan to get you through each occurrence. Another type of Prepper.

Even governments worldwide have various programs and agencies to address “disasters” and “emergencies”. Take a look at the FEMA and Homeland Security “Be Prepared” and “Are You Ready” websites. - Would this incident have an effect on other parts of the country and what would they be?
- What would your neighbors and friends do?
- If you live rural, how easy is it for urban people to get to where you are even if they walked?

What would you and your family do in the following scenarios?:

- A hurricane, tornado, flood or 7.8 earthquake hits tomorrow at 3PM?
- Plastic disappears and humans cannot make more tomorrow at 12 noon?
- Mexico enters a civil war and refugees start flooding our borders tomorrow at 6PM?
- The State comes by and puts meters on your private domestic water well tomorrow morning at 7AM?
- This Monday you are called at work because your house is on fire?
- There is some kind of explosion or attack at one or more oil refineries, storage facilities or power plants, here in the U.S. tomorrow at 12 midnight?
- Your primary wage earner is laid off this Friday?
- Starting tomorrow at 10AM; There is a very large gang in the streets setting fires and spreading destruction in a major city near you, civil upheaval is spreading with each passing hour?
- Thursday while at the grocery store the roof collapses?
- Income and property taxes double the end of this month?
- The sun has a 1859 sized solar storm and it wipes out micro and radio waves, TV/Satellite transmissions and electricity worldwide tomorrow at 1AM?

One thing is for sure – In a disaster or wide spread emergency - **You CANNOT count on any government or emergency agency to come to your rescue in a timely fashion. The only things you can count on are yourself (physical, emotional & spiritual), your knowledge and skills and the supplies and tools you have on hand.**

I have long been a hiker and backpacker. I love the outdoors and nature. I love the idea of being self-reliant and have been researching, learning and planning for moving to a rural area with a small, as self-reliant as possible homestead.
